



SAVortex: Health and safety policy statement

Health and Safety at Work Act 1974

SAVortex Limited recognises that complying with the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 (and regulations made under it) is a legal requirement, not a matter of choice.

SAVortex Ltd's policy is to exceed the minimum requirements of the law where possible and to do this we will provide sufficient resources to meet this commitment. We will also ensure that systems are in place that will allow us to maintain, monitor and, where necessary, improve safety performance. Included in these systems will be the means to allow communication and consultation on health and safety matters between all levels of the business.

In return, the Company expects employees at all levels to exceed their minimum legal duties, which are given later in our organisational responsibilities.

Any information, instruction, training or supervision necessary to meet these commitments will be provided to those who require it in order to perform their job safely. The policy and the way it has operated will be reviewed at least annually and more often if the business changes in nature or size. Any revision necessary to improve safety performance will be made and then reported to employees.

In summary our statement of general health and safety policy is:

- to provide adequate control of the health and safety risks arising from our work activities;
- to consult with our employees on matters affecting their health and safety;
- to provide and maintain safe plant and equipment;
- to ensure safe handling and use of substances;
- to provide information, instruction and supervision for employees;
- to ensure all employees are competent to do their tasks, and to give them adequate training;
- to prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health;
- to maintain safe and healthy working conditions;
